Dear Neighbor,

We're writing to you today to help us in the effort to stop a new State Bill that will threaten our neighborhoods.

State Bill 79 will allow 65-75 ft high apartment developments in single-

family and light industrial areas that are within a half mile of a light rail or bus stops. That will affect large areas of our City!

If we do not amend this bill we will not be able to stop 6-7 story apartment buildings next to our homes. LA has plenty of capacity to build much needed housing on our commercial corridors without the need to intrude into our single-family neighborhoods. Help us amend this bill to exclude single-family, light industrial and historic zones. Remember if this becomes State law, we cannot stop the impact of this bill.

Los Angeles City Planning is pleased to announce the release of a <u>Draft Policy Updates and Ordinance Amendments document</u> for public review and feedback. Based on the <u>2022 Assessment</u> <u>Report</u> commissioned by City Planning, the document outlines proposed administrative changes, ordinance amendments, and resource allocations for the Mills Act program. The goals of the proposed updates and amendments are the long-term sustainability of the Mills Act Historical Property Contract program and a more equitable distribution of the program's benefits.

Since 1996, the Mills Act program has served as Los Angeles's primary financial incentive for historic preservation, offering property tax savings for owners who invest in the rehabilitation and restoration of historic buildings.

## PROVIDE YOUR INPUT

City Planning invites comments on the <u>Draft Policy Updates and</u> <u>Ordinance Amendments</u>document through a <u>feedback form</u>. The deadline for providing comments is May 23, 2025.

Staff will present the proposed changes to the Mills Act program to the Cultural Heritage Commission. In addition, the Department will conduct an evening public workshop that will be held over Zoom. Members of the public will have the opportunity to make comments and ask questions. Information about these events is listed below and on the <u>City Planning website</u>.

Following feedback from the two public outreach events, City Planning will develop a final draft of proposed policy updates and revised ordinance amendments. The Cultural Heritage Commission will then review and consider these updates and make their recommendations to the City Council.
